### Art Commission for the Van Pelt/Opie Library

For the last three years the Friends of the Van Pelt Library have been buying art for the enlarged new Van Pelt/Opie library. Works from local artists such as Joyce Koskenmaki, MaryAnn Beckwith, John Hubbard and Joe Kirkish now hang throughout the Library.

However, because of its scale, the beautiful Opie Reading Room posed a special challenge. The Friends of the Van Pelt Library therefore commissioned a large felt piece from Phyllis Fredendall, Associate Professor, Art & Design (Fiber/Fashion Design) at Finlandia University in neighboring Hancock, MI.

Phyllis had never made such a large piece. It is approximately 11' long and 5' wide. A special structure had to be designed to enable it to hang due to the weight of the piece. This brilliantly colored felt work will hang in the Opie Reading Room on the south wall, next to the large curved window and facing the front entrance to the library. This work was inspired by photographs of the old mining shafts and shaft maps that are such a part of our Keweenaw mining heritage.

Phyllis will be present at our Annual Meeting, Thursday October 30<sup>th</sup>, to talk about the process of creating this work and to answer questions.

#### 2008 Friends Book Sale Breaks All Records




Figure 1: Proceeds from Friends Book Sale since 1998




Figure 2: Proceeds from Friends Book Cart since 2000

#### MTU Van Pelt Library Welcomes Interim Library Director Christa Walck

The retirement of University Librarian Phyllis Johnson in spring 2008 marks the start of a new era at the Van Pelt Library. Professor Christa Walck, outgoing Dean of the School of Business, has agreed to lead the Library for the next year as the vision is shaped for the Library of the future.

Walck met with the Friends Board in September and shared with them some of the things that have been happening in the Library and ideas that are being considered for the Library. One of the key ideas is service at the point of need, meaning that the Library is going to reach out to its constituencies to maintain and improve library services. To that end the information technology services of the Library have been outsourced. It is hoped that this will ease the burden of maintaining the electronic infrastructure in the Library.

The MTU Center for Teaching and Learning and Faculty Development under Bill Kennedy is moving

to the Library building, bringing an additional faculty resource under the same roof with the essential resources provided by the Library. In addition, distance learning programs under Patti Lins has also moved in to the building.

Other changes being pursued in the Library are some physical changes to expand the 24-hour space that is available in the Library. Walck also said that the Library is looking into using some of the twenty-two study rooms as special purpose rooms. One might be used as a student leadership learning center and another might be used for the honors institute.

Finally, Dave Brule, MTU Board of Control member, generously donated funds to purchase a fancy coffee machine for the Library. A coffee bar area will be built to house the coffee machine – perhaps on the first floor of the Library in the windowed corner. The coffee bar would serve coffee as well as some snack items. It would be managed and staffed by the Memorial Union.

These and other changes represent the beginning of exciting things at the Library. The Friends welcome Walck to the Van Pelt Library and look forward to an ongoing positive relationship with her and her Library staff.

# Econo Foods "Computers for Kids" Program Starts Up for 2008
